

tips for travel

things you should know

Here are some tips to make your airport experience hassle-free:

- Arrive at the airport early, at least 2 hours ahead of departure time.
- Wear comfortable shoes that can easily be removed during the security screening process
- Ensure that you have the required travel documents (valid passports and drivers license) readily available at all times to present to the security officials and to Bahamasair agents upon request.
- Remember, carrying sharp or other dangerous objects that can be used as weapons are strictly prohibited aboard the aircraft. Both your checked and carry-on baggage will be screened. Pack appropriately to avoid any inconvenience at the security checkpoints.
- Please be aware of items that may cause delays during the security screening process. Jewelry, belt buckles, keys, phones, pagers, etc. should be placed in carry-on baggage and not left on your person.
- Film should be packed in carry-on baggage as equipment used to screen checked baggage may damage undeveloped film.
- Gifts in your carry-on baggage should not be wrapped as they may be opened during the security screening process.
- Remain in the departure lounge to await the boarding of your flight, and to hear any announcements regarding delays etc.

baggage tips

- Place identification tags on all baggage both inside and outside.
- Always carry medications, valuables and breakable objects in your carry-on baggage
- Federal regulations require that firearms in checked baggage must be unloaded and declared when baggage is presented for check-in.
- Do not over pack your bag
- Do not lock your bag

checked baggage allowance

- 2 checked bags up to 70 lbs (32kg) each with maximum dimensions of 62" (157cm) each

carry-on Baggage Allowance

- Carry-On baggage carried on board the aircraft must be able to fit under the passenger seat in front of you or in the overhead compartment.

additional free carry-on items

The following items may be carried on free in addition to the free baggage allowance:

- One fully collapsible wheelchair and/or a pair of crutches and/or braces of other prosthetic device for the passenger's use, provided the passenger is dependent upon them, may be carried in the luggage compartment of the aircraft.
- One fully collapsible child's stroller or push chair.
- A handbag, pocket book or purse that is appropriate to normal traveling attire and is not being used to carry articles that would otherwise be considered baggage.
- An overcoat, wrap or blanket.
- An umbrella or walking stick.
- A small camera or a pair of binoculars.
- A reasonable amount of reading material for the flight.
- Infant's food for consumption on flight.
- Infant's carrying basket.
- One light garment bag. The garment bag must not contain any hard objects.
